## 3. Accurate measurements

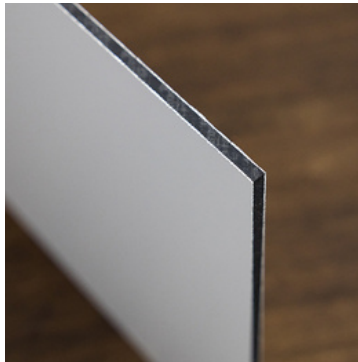
